Traumatic Experiences of Normal Development: A Trauma-Based Listening Perspective

This course presents psychoanalytic perspectives on the treatment of trauma. The reconstruction of object relations, an integration with intersubjectivity, and somatization are addressed in light of a redefinition of trauma. Various kinds of traumatic events are examined in terms of their roots in normal development and their role in the etiology of difficulties such as depression, anxiety, addictions, and eating disorders and their contribution to the formation of character structure and relationship style. Therapeutic approaches based on the instructor's trauma-based listening perspective (SAO/TEND) will be emphasized.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES: Participants will be able to (1) describe the trauma-based listening perspective and explain how it differs from other listening perspectives, (2) define the new meaning of trauma, (3) explain the reconstructed meaning of an object relationship, (4) explain the subjective nature of trauma, (5) identify self subcomponents in an object relations unit (ORU), (6) identify affect subcomponents in an object relations unit (ORU), (7) explain the roles of splitting, dissociation, and attacks on linking in traumatic experience, (8) explain the roles of the good-enough mother (GEM) and predator other (PO) in traumatic experience, (9) recognize various forms of attacks on knowing, and (10) explain the SAO/TEND trauma-based listening perspective and its application to clinical material.
