# Syllabus CMPS Distance Learning ZOOM Ecopsychoanalysis and the Psychology of Climate Change J. Dodds Spring 2020

## Wednesday10 -11:30AM (EST)

#### **Course Description**

In our era of anxiety, denial, paranoia, apathy, guilt, hope, and despair in the face of climate change, ecopsychoanalysis is a new interdisciplinary approach to thinking about the relationship between psychoanalysis, ecology, 'the natural', and the climate crisis. It draws on a range of fields including, psychoanalysis, psychology, ecology, philosophy, science, complexity and nonlinear dynamical systems theory, aesthetics and the humanities. Climate change is perhaps the single biggest threat to have faced our species, but existing approaches largely constitute an ecology without psychology. Psychoanalysis has a unique role to play with its emphasis on the unconscious dimensions of our mental and social lives, however, despite being essential to studying environmentalism and its discontents, psychoanalysis remains largely a psychology without ecology. This course aims to bridge this gap.

## **Course Objectives**

The student will be able to:

- summarize and contrast a range of psychological approaches to climate change and the environmental crisis;
- demonstrate attainment of interpretive ecopsychoanalytic perspectives on a range of phenomenon including not only ecology, but also culture, art and society;
- describe foundational concepts in the science of climate change and the Earth system;
- provide examples of how psychoanalytic and psychological models of the mind can include a broader engagement with the nonhuman world; and
- enumerateseveral of the anxieties and defenses involved in climate change and explain how to engage creatively in new ways with their manifestations in their social and work environment and the wider culture.
